## CRIME IN THE SPOTLIGHT



### Burglary Case #16-55817:

On September 30, 2016, Deputy A. Curtin responded to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, in North Beach, for the report of a home burglary. The victim explained they had left their home unlocked and while they were gone, had received a call from someone claiming to represent the Rental Center they recently purchased a television from. This person stated they still owed money on the television but the victim stated it was already paid in full. Upon returning home, they observed the 65" RCA LED/LCD Smart TV was gone and a door hanger was hanging on their front door. The victim also reported a couple of weeks prior how they were approached by a black male, driving a Penske truck, claiming to represent this same company. He had stated he needed to come in to their home and verify the VIN on the TV set they had purchased. The male was refused entry.

### Burglary Case #16-55354:

On September 28, 2016, Deputy K. Williamson was dispatched to Watson Road, in Owings, for the report of a possible burglary. Upon arrival the complainant stated they had closed their garage door at 7:30pm on September 27 and found it opened several inches that morning around 11:00am. The home was not entered and no items appeared to be missing.

**Burglary Case #16-55315:**

On September 28, 2016, Deputy R. Weems responded to a report of a burglary at the Harbor Island Marina on Charles Street, in Solomon's. The complainant explained that someone forced entry into a shed on the gas dock by breaking the lock and stole money. This crime took place sometime between 8:30pm on September 27th - 5:30am the next morning.

**Burglary Case #16-55267:**

On September 28, 2016, Deputy N. Barger observed a suspicious vehicle parked in a driveway on Perspective Place, in Owings, with a male standing near an open door, wearing gloves. Upon investigation he witnessed faint marks on the weather stripping near the lock, indicating the door may have been pried open. He questioned **Raymond Goode, Sr., 51**, of St. Leonard, and determined he did not have authority to enter the home. Mr. Goode admitted that he drove himself to the residence. Deputy Barger confirmed Mr. Goode's driver's license was suspended and previously revoked multiple times. He was charged with the appropriate traffic violations and arrested for 4th Degree Burglary.

**CDS Violation Case #16-56084:**

On October 1, 2016, at approximately 11:30pm, Deputy J. Livingston observed a vehicle being driven unsafely, crossing the center line and driving onto the shoulder several times. He pulled the vehicle over in the Prince Frederick, Green Turtle parking lot and made contact with the driver, **Eric Carr, 24**, of Owings. Mr. Carr began cursing and would not cooperate with instructions. Deputy Livingston discovered illegal drugs in the vehicle. Carr was arrested and charged with CDS: Possession of a Narcotic (Heroin), CDS: Possession of intent to Distribute a Narcotic (Heroin), Possession of Paraphernalia (syringes), Fail to Obey Reasonable/Lawful Order and Resisting Arrest.

**CDS Violation Case #16-55617:**

On September 29, 2016, Deputy T. Buckler responded to the area of the Peking Inn Restaurant located on E. Chesapeake Beach Road, in Chesapeake Beach for a check welfare call. The complainant had reported seeing a women walking out into the roadway and seemed to have difficulty walking. Deputy Buckler was able to make contact with a woman, matching the description, who was sitting near the restaurant's front door. Upon questioning **Stacy Mandley-Adams, 37**, of North Beach, he witnessed her slurring her words and appeared to be "out of it". He determined Ms. Mandley-Adams to be in illegal possession of Suboxone and a hypodermic syringe. She was arrested and transported to the Detention Center and also served an outstanding Warrant for a Violation of Probation from Virginia.

**Destruction of Property Case #16-55657:**

On September 29, 2016, Deputy S. Rediker responded to Long Beach Drive, in St. Leonard, for the report of damaged property. The victim reported seeing tire marks in his yard, damage to a water meter and mailbox. This crime took place sometime during the day, with no known suspects at this time.

**Destruction of Property Case #16-55215:**

On September 27, 2016, Deputy C. Callison was dispatched to the Prince Frederick 7-11 for the report of vandalism to the business. Sometime around 8:30pm an unknown person spray painted "PFHK" on the outside of the building with lime green paint.

**Destruction of Property Case #16-55036:**

On September 24, 2016, Deputy P. Wood responded to the Sheriff's Office to speak with a victim wanting to report damage to their vehicle. The complainant explained they were driving on Thunderbird Drive, in Lusby, and their vehicle was struck by what they later found to be a cinder block. The cinder block struck the top of the right front quarter panel causing a large dent. There are no known suspects at this time.

**Destruction of Property Case #16-55035:**

On September 27, 2016, Deputy R. Naughton was dispatched to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, in North Beach, for the report of damaged property. The victim reported they had parked their vehicle at 4:00pm on September 26 and returned around 6:30am and saw that the window on the rear lift gate had been shattered. The victim also reported a small hole in the vinyl siding near the entrance to their front door. It is unknown what object was used to cause the damage but it is possible a pellet or BB gun was used.

**Theft Case #16-56035:**

On October 1, 2016, at approximately 8:00pm, Deputy P. Aurich was dispatched to the Dunkirk Walmart for the report of a shoplifter in custody. The Asset Protection Officer observed a female shoplifter empty the contents of their purse, place a black PVC backpack over their shoulder and attempt to exit the store without making payment for the backpack. **Donna Hylton, 50**, of Owings, was taken into custody and charged with Trespassing on Private Property (from a previous situation where she was instructed not to return to the store), Theft Less than \$100.00, and Possession of Controlled Paraphernalia (a Jail inventory search revealed a hypodermic syringe in a pocket of her purse).

**Theft Case #16-55987:**

On October 1, 2016, at approximately 1:00pm, Deputy A. Curtin was dispatched to Dunleigh Drive, in Dunkirk, for the report of a theft. The victim stated that sometime between 11:00pm on September 30 - 1:00pm on October 1, someone smashed a vehicle window and stole money from the center console. No known suspects at this time.

**Theft Case #16-55820:**

On September 30, 2016, Deputy J. Harms was dispatched to the Prince Frederick Library for the report of a theft. The complainant explained that money had been taken from an unsecured desk at the library.

**Theft Case #16-55776:**

On September 30, 2016, Deputy W. Durner was dispatched to Duchess Lane, in Huntingtown, for the report of a theft. The complainant explained that he had two (2) contractors in his home between September 25 - 29<sup>th</sup> and did not witness a theft, but his Motorola APX 7000 police radio, Motorola hand mic and radio holder are now missing. The investigation is continuing.

**Theft Case #16-55631:**

On September 29, 2016, Deputy C. Fox responded to Harrison Boulevard, in Chesapeake Beach, for the report of a theft. The complainant explained that a gray iPhone 6, with an orange and blue otter box case, had been stolen from a book bag that was at the Northern High School earlier that morning.

**Theft Case #16-55124:**

On September 27, 2016, Deputy P. Mosely responded to August Drive, in Port Republic, for the report of a mail theft. The victim stated she had ordered several window shades and became concerned she had not yet received them. Upon contacting Fed Ex she was told the package had been delivered on September 17, at 1:30pm, and placed in front of their attached garage. There are no known suspects at this time.

### **Theft Case #16-55100:**

On September 27, 2016, Deputy V. O'Donnell responded to Asbury Circle, in Solomon's, for the report of a theft. The Director of the Facility stated one of the residents had reported money stolen out of their apartment. This crime took place between 9:30am on September 20 and 8:30am on September 27<sup>th</sup>.

### **Theft Case #16-55075:**

On September 27, 2016, at approximately 9:00am, Deputy A. Curtin was dispatched to Dunkirk Way, in Dunkirk, for the report of a theft. The victim reported they had four (4) black circular lawn lights and two (2) light posts with octagon lights stolen. The lights were hardwired into the ground; the electrical cable was cut and the lights were removed from the ground.

**Theft/Shoplifting:** On 9/26/16 at 7:40 am, Trooper Kaitz responded to the Giant in Prince Frederick for a shoplifting complaint. **Kim M. Parrish**, 32 of Prince Frederick, was witnessed placing several items of food into her purse and attempted to leave the store without paying for them. She was detained and subsequently arrested for shoplifting. Ms. Parrish was incarcerated at the Calvert County Detention Center.

**Theft of Trailer:** On 9/26/16 at 12:55 pm, Trooper Kaitz responded to the barrack to handle a theft complaint. The victim reported a Carr, black cargo trailer had been stolen by unknown suspect(s) from the residence in North Beach. The Maryland registration on the trailer is 058072X. Investigation continues.

**Possession of Cocaine and Disorderly Conduct:** On 9/28/16 at 9:03 pm, Trooper First Class Costello responded to the Barstow 7-11 for a complaint of subject acting disorderly. TFC Costello found **Austin B. Leaman**, 21 of Lusby, asleep on the floor. Prior to arriving, Leaman had grabbed a doughnut out of the display case and threw it. He knocked items off the counter and sat on it. Then after removing his shoes, went to sleep blocking the entire aisle in the store. Leaman was found to be in possession of cocaine. He was arrested for possession, paraphernalia and disorderly conduct. He was incarcerated at the Calvert County Detention Center.

**Theft of Amplifier:** On 9/30/16 at 7:25 pm, Corporal Oles responded to the 11600 block of Mohican Lane in Lusby for a theft report. The victim reported that sometime on September 7, his Amplifier had been stolen. A suspect was developed and the victim reported the amplifier may have been pawned. Investigation continues.

**Possession of Oxycodone:** On 10/2/16 at 12:27 am, Corporal Wiesemann stopped a vehicle on HG Trueman Rd. near Cove Point Rd. in Lusby for traffic violations. **Robert A. Demarr**, 31 of Lusby appeared to be chewing and attempting to swallow an unknown substance. It was determined that the substance was oxycodone. Demarr was arrested for possession of oxycodone and incarcerated at the Calvert County Detention Center.

### **Burglary Attempt Case #16-53700:**

On September 20, 2016, Deputy A. Woodford was dispatched to Christiana Parran Road, in Chesapeake Beach, for the report of an attempted burglary. The complainant advised a front window of their residence, which is kept locked, was now unlocked. He suspected the incident took place sometime on September 15<sup>th</sup>. The home was not entered and no outdoor items appear to be missing.

### **Burglary Attempt Case #16-53527:**

On September 19, 2016, at approximately 10:50pm, Deputy S. Rediker responded to Olivet Road, in Lusby, for the report of an attempted burglary. The homeowners reported that at 10:40pm they heard someone tampering with their

front door doorknob. Shortly thereafter, someone attempted to open a window on the front of the house. No entry was made and no known suspects at this time.

**Burglary Case #16-53521:**

On September 19, 2016, at approximately 10: 20pm, Deputy N. Buckler witnessed someone standing in front of a glass door of the Aquatic Center, in Prince Frederick, within the secured fenced-in area. The Center was closed for the evening so he made contact with the subject, **Olivia Hefter, 23**, of Hughesville, MD. She admitted she had planned to spend the night at the Center; Deputy Buckler witnessed the door was unsecured and partially opened. She was transported to the Detention Center and charged with 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Burglary of a Storehouse.

**Burglary Case #16-53517:**

On September 19, 2016, at approximately 8:00pm, Deputy A. Woodford responded to Merry Lane, in Huntingtown, for the report of a burglary. The complainant advised he arrived home to find his shed door busted in and the door wide open. He stated he remembered locking the shed door at 10:00am the day before and discovered the damage at 8:00pm that evening. At this time nothing appears to be missing.

**CDS Violation Case #16-54393:**

On September 23, 2016, at approximately 9:45pm, Deputy A. Locke was approached by a concerned citizen, in the parking lot of the Rod & Reel Restaurant, Chesapeake Beach, who told him a female appeared to be passed out in a vehicle. Deputy Locke located the vehicle, with the unresponsive female, **Shaye Beal, 23**, of Lothian, MD. As he made contact and questioned Ms. Beal, he determined she was in Possession of Paraphernalia (plastic baggie) and two (2) hypodermic syringes. She was arrested and transported to the Detention Center.

### CDS Violation Case #16-53461:

On September 19, 2016, at approximately 4:00pm, Deputy R. Shrawder responded to a 911 dispatch that an intoxicated driver was seen weaving all over the road. He was able to come into contact with the driver, **William Whitney, 48**, of North Beach, at the base of the Thomas Johnson Bridge, in Solomons. He observed Suboxone in the front seat cup holder. He placed Mr. Whitney under arrest for CDS: Possession of a Synthetic narcotic (Suboxone), Driving/attempting to drive while impaired by controlled dangerous substance and for Driving/attempting to driver while impaired by drug(s) and or alcohol.

### Disorderly Conduct Case #16-53734:

On September 20, 2016, at approximately 10:00pm, Deputy A. Ostazeski responded to the area of St. Leonard Road/Toms Lane, in St. Leonard, for the report of a subject lying in the road next to a bicycle. Upon arrival he identified the subject as **Edward Kiger, Jr. 27**, of Chesapeake Beach, who had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath and person. An ambulance was requested; upon evaluating him, he began to sit up but refused to cooperate and would not follow instructions. He continued to yell, attempted to walk away and fell in the grass. A search of the grassy area revealed a hypodermic syringe lying next to him. He was arrested for CDS: Administer Equipment Possession/Distribute (syringe), CDS: Possession of Paraphernalia (syringe), Resist/Interfere with Arrest, Fail to Obey Reasonable/Lawful Order, Disorderly Conduct, Alcohol Beverage/Intoxicated Endanger, Alcohol Beverage/Retail Area Drink.

### Theft Case #16-54338:

On September 23, 2016, at approximately 7:00pm, Deputy G. Gott was dispatched to Pine Trail, in Lusby, for the report of a theft. The victim explained someone had stolen a package off his front porch that was delivered that day, according to the tracking website. Deputy Gott spoke with the neighbors who had witnessed someone carrying a box through the backyard and was stuck in a briar patch along the wood line. When the suspect later returned to the area, Deputy Weems approached **Raymond Montgomery, 40**, of Bear, Delaware, and determined he was the thief. He was charged on a Criminal Citation for theft under \$100.00 and released on the scene.

### Theft Case #16-54185:

On September 23, 2016, Deputy R. Shrawder responded to Inner Place, in Lusby, for the report of a theft. The complainant reported that sometime between 8:00am on September 14 - 8:30am on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, multiple items were stolen from inside their boat: 4 Penn Rod and Reels, 3 open face surf rods, 4 light tackle rods, 6 12-volt batteries, 1 tackle box, 30 lures, 2 50-foot anchor lines, 1 6-foot folding ladder, 2 folding crab pots, 2 umbrella rigs and 1 fishing rig. No known suspects at this time.

Upon arrival he made contact with the complaint who advised the registration sticker to his vehicle had been stolen. Due to the vehicle having been serviced in another location for over three (3) months, it is unclear where the crime took place.

On September 22, 2016, Deputy J. Denton was dispatched to Jesus the Good Shepherd Church located on West Mount Harmony Road, in Owings, for the report of a theft. A concrete statue that was in the outdoor prayer garden area was stolen between September 12 - 16<sup>th</sup>. \*\* It should be noted on September 3<sup>rd</sup>, Father King had previously reported another statue theft taking place at the entrance of the church.

**Theft Case #16-53991:**

On September 22, 2016, Deputy V. O'Donnell arrived at the Tiki Bar located on Charles Street, in Solomons, to respond to a theft report. The Manager explained that a black iPod, capable of scanning a license, was stolen from the establishment. This crime took place sometime between September 19 - 22.

**Theft Case #16-53718:**

On September 20, 2016, Deputy S. Rediker responded to the Lusby Giant grocery store, on Rousby Hall Road, for the report of a shoplifting that had just occurred. The manager stated several suspects (2 adult B/M males and 1 adult B/F carrying a baby) attempted to push two (2) full carts of groceries out of the store without purchasing the items. They fled the store in a vehicle, leaving behind one of the carts.

On September 20, 2016, Deputy R. Burggraff responded to Lloyd Bowen Road, in St. Leonard, for the report of a theft. The Property Manager stated there were three (3) HVAC units stolen from two (2) homes on the property. He last noticed the HVAC units on September 16 around 9:00am.

On September 19, 2016, Deputy D. Clark responded to Caney Court, in Prince Frederick, to recover a possible stolen motorcycle. Deputy Clark determined the white Kawasaki, located in the complainant's shed, was, in fact, reported stolen from Montgomery County. Upon questioning **Bryan King, 28**, of Prince Frederick, he admitted purchasing the Kawasaki from an unknown person and knew it was stolen when he bought it. During the investigation it was also discovered King was in Possession of a controlled dangerous substance (Heroin) and Possession of CDS paraphernalia (plastic wrapper). He was placed in handcuffs and transported to the Detention Center where he will be charged with theft \$1,000 to \$10,000, Possession of a Controlled Dangerous Substance-Not Marijuana and Possession of Paraphernalia.
